

TALENTED TAILS

Tamanduas are closely related to giant anteaters. Just like giant anteaters, they eat mostly ants and termites that they slurp up with their long, sticky tongues. They do however, have one BIG difference — their tails. Giant anteater tails are bushy which allow them to use their tails as blankets or umbrellas, but tamandua tails have very little hair and are instead used like an extra hand to hold on to tree branches while climbing. This type of tail is called prehensile.
