

# Position Description Zoo Keeper

Come join us at the Reid Park Zoological Society!

Reid Park Zoological Society is seeking a Zoo Keeper. This is an exciting time to be a part of the Reid Park Zoo team. Thanks to an extremely supportive community we will be investing 60 million dollars in renovations and creating new habitats over the next 10 years. This will include an expansion dedicated to Asian animals.

As part of our team you will work closely with our dedicated Animal Welfare Specialist, Veterinary Team (in partnership with the University of Arizona Veterinary School), and experienced mentors to grow your skills and provide excellent animal welfare to a diverse collection. You will also have the opportunity to be part of active Training, Enrichment, Green and DEAI committees.

Reid Park Zoo is located in Tucson, AZ, a vibrant, growing community that benefits from fabulous weather, diverse culture, and a lower cost of living than much of the country.

The successful candidate will have at least 5 years of paid experience in an AZA accredited institution and a Bachelor's or Associate's Degree. Experience with positive reinforcement training, record keeping and welfare tracking, keeper talks and goal-based enrichment are desired.

The Society is a 501(c) (3) nonprofit organization whose mission is to create inspiring memories for all by connecting people and animals to ensure the protection of wild animals and wild places. We provide educational and fun experiences for visitors of all ages. Reid Park Zoo is the largest attended cultural attraction in Southern Arizona with approximately 500,000 visitors annually.

#### Overview:

Reid Park Zoo animal care staff, including these positions, work with a variety of animals including Ambassador Animals, wild dogs, monkeys, a wide variety of birds, lemurs, bears, cats, hoof stock, large reptiles, capybara, anteaters and others. The Keeper will provide high quality care for the animals in their area as well as assist with habitat and night house maintenance. Variable shift work is possible. Animal care includes behavioral observations, positive reinforcement training, preparing and providing enrichment, cleaning, engaging with the welfare committee as well as the supervisory and vet team. The Keeper will be responsible for daily record-keeping including daily reports, medication logs, welfare tracking, enrichment records, animal training records and area notes. The Keeper may work in a variety of animal areas and may be a swing or primary keeper of an area. Work assignments are subject to the hazards inherent in caring for wild animals in captivity.

# Responsibilities:

#### **Animal Care**

- Daily cleaning associated with animal night house, habitat, and visitor viewing area.
- Variable shift work is possible with a couple of night shifts each month.
- Husbandry care for the animals in the area (feeding, medicating, training, enriching and care specific to the species).
- Completes reports including but not limited to daily animal reports, enrichment logs, water quality logs, training logs, medication logs, animal incident reports, etc.
- Develops & implements enrichment activities for animals following AZA quidelines and per department practices and protocols.
- Trains utilizing positive reinforcement to aid in animal management & promote visitor education.
- Monitor animal welfare and report concerns to the supervisor.
- Follows all animal care protocols and policies.
- Assist in the training of new staff and mentoring volunteers.
- Completes all training as required. These may include but are not limited to job specific training, safety, zoonotic disease, blood borne pathogens, animal enrichment, animal training, conservation, Species Survival Plan, active shooter, DEI, radio protocol, CPR/ First Aid, hand tool usage and heavy equipment operation such as skid steer/ fork lift truck.
- If working with large and/ or dangerous animals, works in a protected, positive reinforcement management style.
- If working in elephant area, hands-on work and progression under direction of Zoo Area Supervisor of Elephants and General Curator; hands-on work always completed with 2 qualified elephant keepers
- Be able to perform those tasks that are essential to the job, with or without reasonable accommodation.

#### Communication

- Participates in formal presentations e.g. Keeper talks, special events, behind-thescenes tours etc.
- Answers visitor questions concerning animals, conservation, zoo operations, etc.
- Participates in AZA groups including SSP and TAGs

### Health & Safety

- Assists in the capture and/or physical/ chemical restraint & transportation of animals.
- Participates in emergency drills. These may include but are not limited to dangerous animal escape, fire, medical or weather emergencies.
- Willing to maintain proficiency with darting equipment & firearms if you choose to try out for Safety Team and are subsequently selected. Willingness to serve on the Safety Team.
- Responds to animal emergencies following approved protocols.
- Stays current on required vaccinations.

#### Administrative Functions

Perform duties in accordance with RPZS policies such as completing expense reports and purchasing or cash handling procedures.

Provide excellent customer service as a component of all job duties.

Complete all animal records in variety of software programs including Animal Care Software, ZIMS, etc

## **Preferred Qualifications, Skills and Abilities**

- Bachelor's degree in a biological science, animal or zoology related plus one year paid exotic animal care experience OR Associate's degree with three year's paid exotic animal care.
  - For dangerous animal care this MUST include a minimum 12 months paid experience with dangerous animals.
- Work experience within an AZA accredited facility preferred.
- Willing to undertake an annual TB skin test (AZA requirement).
- Must be able to lift up to 50 pounds.
- Regular physical attendance at work.
- Must be able to work outdoors in a variety of weather conditions.
- Work assignments are subject to the hazards inherent in caring for exotic & dangerous animals in a zoological institution.
- Demonstrated critical analysis, customer service, problem solving, conflict resolution, decision making, leadership, team building, time management, and motivational skills.

- Demonstrated ability to tactfully handle stressful situations, negotiate and resolve conflicts, maintain confidentiality and to respect and observe organizational protocol.
- Demonstrated ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with all levels of RPZS and coworkers as well as diverse volunteers, guests, donors, community partners, vendors and others.
- Able to work a flexible work schedule and adjust as required. Weekend, special events and some holiday work are required.
